United Way celebrates its 85th anniversary this year, and Good Samaritan Agency its 120th year of existence. The pair have been partners throughout, always making a difference in the community.


As one of HoMEUW vetted partners for decades, Good Samaritan provides high quality childcare services as well as a single parent program. At Good Samaritan, the staff isn't just watching your child, they are paying attention.

Aurora started attending Good Samaritan at 5 weeks, and her mom Miranda started working there at the same time. It was a perfect package of employment and daycare needed to make things work in Miranda's life when she needed help.

However, the story doesn't end there. The staff at Good Samaritan, while caring for Aurora, was able to determine that Aurora needed help with her gross motor skills. The early intervention provided access to physical therapy and has significantly impacted her growth.

"Good Samaritan made such a difference for us, I'm not sure where we'd be without them," Miranda said.

Aurora started school in the fall of 2021, and now Miranda has joined her in the Bangor School System as an ed tech. Community support through United Way allowed Good Samaritan to give them a hand when they needed it.


